1. Nomination to the departmental coordinator by E-Mail required.

2. A signed preliminary learning agreement should be sent at least four weeks prior to arriving at Freiburg, even though it will probably have to be modified at a later stage. Students' application for an international mobility at Freiburg University is only possible by use of the online application form available on website <u>https://www.verwaltung.uni-freiburg.de/move/moveonline/incoming/welcome.php</u>

2. The receiving institution will send its decision within 8 weeks from nomination deadline.

3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 8 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.

4. Termination of the agreement: The inter-institutional agreement may be amended by mutual agreement. The inter-institutional agreement may be terminated by either party. [It is up to the involved institutions to agree on the procedure for modifying or terminating the inter-institutional agreement. However, in the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. This means that a unilateral decision to discontinue the exchanges notified to the other party by 1 September 20XX will only take effect as of 1 September 20XX+1. The termination clauses must include the following disclaimer: If the agreement is signed for more than one academic year, the partners commit to amend the agreement in case of changes in the mobility data by no later than the end of January in the preceding academic year. Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.

1. Grading systems of the institutions

The University of Crete uses the European Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS).

University of Crete grading system is characterized as follows:

EXCELLENT: from 8.50 to 10,

VERY GOOD: from 6.50 to 8.49,

GOOD: from 5 to 6.49,

Minimum passing grade is 5

Grade less than 5 in the individual courses indicates failure.

D FREIBUR01: In German universities (except for law schools) a 1 to 5 scale is used:

1,0-1,3 sehr gut (very good: an outstanding achievement)

1,7-2,3 gut (good: an achievement which lies substantially above average requirements)

2,7-3,3 befriedigend (satisfactory: an achievement which corresponds to average requirements)

3,7-4,0 ausreichend (sufficient: an achievement which barely meets the requirements)

5,0 nicht ausreichend / nicht bestanden (not sufficient / failed: an achievement which does not

meet the requirements)
