Inter-institutional agreement 2018-2019 to 2020-2021 between programme countries

The institutions named below agree to cooperate for the exchange of students in the context of the Erasmus+ programme. They commit to respect the quality requirements of the Erasmus Charter for Higher Education in all aspects related to the organisation and management of the mobility, in particular the recognition of the credits awarded to students by the partner institution.

This agreement shall commence [OR be deemed to have commenced] on 01/07/2018 and shall continue, unless terminated earlier in accordance with clause E.4, until 30/09/2021 when it shall terminate automatically without notice.

The schedule forms part of this agreement and shall have effect as if set out in full in the body of this agreement.

In German universities (except for law schools) a 1 to 5 scale is used:

- 1,0-1,3 sehr gut (very good: an *outstanding* achievement)
- 1,7-2,3 gut (good: an achievement which lies substantially above average requirements)
- 2,7-3,3 befriedigend (satisfactory: an achievement which corresponds to average requirements)
- 3,7-4,0 ausreichend (sufficient: an achievement which barely meets the requirements)
- 5,0 nicht ausreichend / nicht bestanden (not sufficient / failed: an achievement which does not meet the requirements)

SCHEDULE 1

OTHER ACADEMIC AND ORGANISATIONAL ASPECTS OF THE EXCHANGE

1. Balance in the number of exchange students

Whilst Section B sets out the maximum number of students the institutions may select to participate in the exchange:

- a. the institutions will consult annually to decide the number of students to participate in the program; and
- b. if the institutions do not exchange the same number of students in any one year, they will review the exchange program annually to ensure that a balance in the number of students exchanged is achieved during the term of this agreement.

2. Selection criteria for students

Each institution will select outgoing students based on internal selection criteria determined by the home institution.

Institutions' infrastructure to welcome students with disabilities

Both institutions confirm their ability to provide all necessary support for students with disabilities mobile under this agreement, when acting both as a host and sending institution.

- 4. Policies applicable to exchange students
 - a. Exchange students shall comply with all rules, regulations, statutes, policies and performance standards of the receiving institution.
 - b. Any disciplinary procedure instituted against an exchange student shall be managed by the receiving institution in accordance with its regulations, policies and procedures.

5. Intellectual property:

Any intellectual property developed by Exchange Students during the study period shall be managed by the Host Institution's policy or regulations applicable to student intellectual property, provided that nothing shall affect the ownership of intellectual property owned or controlled by either party before the start of the study period.

6. Publicity

Neither institution shall use the other institution's name or logo or trademark in any advertising, promotion or sales literature in relation to this agreement, other than to promote the program, without first obtaining the written consent of the other institution.

7. Consequences of Termination

If the agreement is terminated in accordance with clause E.4, termination will not apply to those exchange students already enrolled or accepted by the receiving institution.
